# GROUND-BREAKING RESULTS IN ENGLISH

## Year 7 Pioneers

The English Department at Queen's Park High School has enjoyed an exceptional start to the year. We were delighted to celebrate our best ever GCSE results in the summer: our students achieved more strong passes (Grade 5) than other students nationally, and 20% of our students were in the top 2% of the 500,000 who took the new GCSEs in the summer by scoring the coveted Grade 9 (which rates higher than the former A\* grade). This is a phenomenal achievement for our students. Furthermore, we welcomed our new Year 7 students, who have made a fantastic start to their careers at Queen's Park High School. At the end of last year, we took the decision to increase the challenge in our Key Stage 3 English curriculum, this has been a process over a number of years, and we are now at a point where our students experience a curriculum rich in canonical texts, and have access to the very best that has been written across the ages. Our Year 7 students have this week completed their first assessed pieces, which is an extended critical essay in response to an unseen poem, Seamus Heaney's *Digging*. The quality and insight the students have shown in their responses, as well as their ability to grasp the conventions of traditional academic writing, has been most impressive. Year 7 have exemplified what the school is about: challenging learning experiences; the highest academic standards; and an unrelenting determination to be the very best that we can be.



# WHAT AM I READING...

## Staff share their own book reviews

To enhance and enrich literacy in school and promote a love of reading, 'What I am Reading' is an initiative set up by the English department that gives students an insight into the reading world of their teachers. Staff were asked to write their own synopsis of 'what they are reading', share their own book reviews and rate out of 5 (5 being an excellent read)! Students have found the recommendations inspiring and have been broadening their reading horizons to try new genres and authors.

This new-found adventure is supported by the use of reading passports in some classes; students record genre, author, main characters, events and a synopsis plus a star review of the book. Congratulations to Adel, Reece and Sam in 7EDDW who have already 'travelled' through one book and completed the 'journey' in their passport!





# SUMMER SPORTS CAMP

During the Summer holidays, QPHS ran our first Summer Sports Camp for up to 40 Year 4 & 5 children from partner primary schools. # MY FIRST HALF TERM

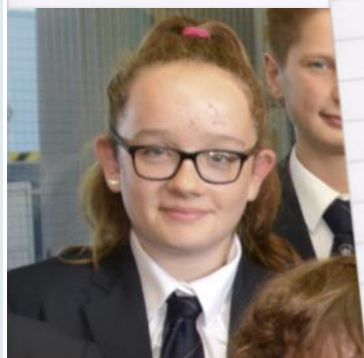
